She made her permanent commitment to CLC in 1992. Daniela was first elected to the World ExCo in Itaici in 1998.

Professionally, she is the Executive Director of the Catholic Media Council in Aachen, Germany. This council works for the development of Church communications in Africa, Asia-Pacific, Central and Eastern Europe and Latin America.

## GEORGE LUNDY, S.J.

George Lundy, S.J., is the Pastor of the Martin Luther King Catholic Student Center in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. He also serves as the Provincial Assistant for Higher Education for the New Orleans Province of the Society of Jesus. Alongside Fr. Lundy's work in Higher Education as President of Wheeling Jesuit University (2000 – 2003), Academic Vice President of the University of Detroit-Mercy (1995 – 2000) and Dean of Faculty at Loyola University in New Orleans (1987 – 1992), is a continued commitment to work for justice and interest in broader social analysis.

His published works include: "Struggling to Make It; A Study of Homelessness in New Orleans" and "School – Parish Financial Linkages and the Viability of Urban Catholic Elementary Schools."

During his tenure at Wheeling Jesuit, George led the University's involvement in "Hopeful City" a faith-based community organization in the city.
